The Okeechobee Dirt Bags requested a Special Project in the amount of \$20,000.00, the Dirt Bags had already raised \$10,000.00 in funds. Bill Wallace asked what if all the funds were not used. A decision was made by the Council to table this request. Cathleen Blair will contact them and request their presence at our next meeting in November.

Cathleen Blair informed the Council that the Rodeo Team had been approved a Special Project for 2020-2021 for \$25,000.00 and had received an email that they did not need the money. However, Cathy Culligan a parent of a participant in the National Rodeo had been told they would receive money for expenses to Nationals. The Council requested more information from the Culligan's and Sherry Trent who is now in charge of the Okeechobee Rodeo Club. Kelly Owens made a motion to approve, Bill Wallace seconded, all approved. Information was received and delivered to the Council in the amount of \$5,859.85 and a majority approved.

Cathleen Blair addressed the Council regarding the Martial Arts Program not following rules and regulations. They had been funded for 20 years. She reviewed errors that were made and continue to be made even after one-on-one assistance. She recommended that the Council not continue funding this program due to the consistent errors over the years. Kelly Owens made a motion to not approve for the 2021-2022 fiscal year, Pat McCoy 2nd, all approved.

As there was no more business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 6:12 p.m., with the next meeting scheduled for Thursday, November 18, 2021 as our regular schedule meeting falls on Veteran's Day.
